ATV Guidelines

The following information is taken from a flyer prepared by the Coconino County Sheriff’s Office.

Any motorcycle or ATV being operated on a street or highway (this includes most National Forest roads) is required to be registered, insured, and the driver is required to possess the appropriate license endorsements. All persons under the age of 18 are required to wear a helmet and eye protection (even on private property). All persons are required to have eye protection. Parents should be aware they may be held accountable for the actions of their minor children if permitted to drive these vehicles (ARS 28-3474).

ATVs and motorcycles must obey all posted speed limits and traffic control signs.

Guest Speakers:

Jackie Denk – Forest Service Kaibab NF, Williams District

Slide presentation on bug infestation. Bark beetles, Aphids, ladybugs. Sticky stuff from the trees comes from aphid infestation. Look under the leaves for evidence of infestation. Sap is called honeydew. It is actually aphid excretions. Also, aphids leave a sooty mold behind. Ants are an indication of aphid infestation. Will not hurt mature trees, but can injure young trees or garden plants. Usually damage is cosmetic only. Aphids transfer diseases from tree to tree. What to do? To control aphids, water the plants. Ladybugs are natural predators. They are great and will eat 50 aphids per day. Larva will eat 25 per day. Monsoon will usually eliminate the aphids. Can spray the aphid infestation to eliminate.

Cicadas are 1-3 inches in length. The males do the singing. Have very large dark eyes and dark in color with red markings. We are in the 12-17 year cycle this year so many are hatching. They live 4-6 weeks, lay 28-48 eggs per tree, and then die. Life cycle eggs, nymph, adult. Eggs are laid in slits in the small twigs. Nymphs will hatch and burrow into the ground and feed on the root system until they emerge from the ground as adults in 12-17 years. Normally will not hurt the trees. Some minor damage will result from the eggs being deposited in the twigs. Some feed on the trees with minor damage. Root damage is minimal from nymph feeding. No control is ok. Water the trees will help. Can net the trees to prevent males access to the trees. Cicadas will not bite but they are noisy.

Ladybugs are good don't kill them. They are here to eat the aphids.

Bark Beetles flourish in drought conditions. Dying trees are a result of bark beetle damage. Mortality will be surveyed in the fall. Most likely it is worse than last year because of the continued draught. Can spray the trees but it is very expensive \$100 per tree. Forest restrictions in place. This Thursday additional restrictions will be added. Bill Williams Mountain will be closed and time restrictions on chain saw use will be put in place. OHV may be restricted.

Herb Johnson – Volunteer Coconino County Sheriff's Department

- Property watch – A free program manned by volunteers ad sponsored by the Coconino Sheriff's dept.
- Thanks for the Herb appreciation day!
- 2 house fires in Parks one saved. SFE VFD responded. Auxiliary supplied the burritos.
- The Dudley's are still leaving their door open!
- Bailey's have a wood pecker drilled a hole in their house in 2001. 2003 he came back and they have another hole in their house.
- 95% drop in crime in the area Herb patrols since last year.
- 7/12 and 8/9 cinder pit will be opened for wood slash/damaged trees and pine needles. Williams pit 7/19 past the country club and gold course off to the right – three sisters Williams Moonset cinder pit is off of old 66 2.5 miles past the Parks store.

Fireboard duties manage affairs of the fire district. All members are elected officials can be appointed by the board of supervisors. Third Tuesday of every month meeting at the firehouse. Call to public is done at every meeting. Chance to voice any concerns. Budget is published in local Williams’s paper. Board picks the fire chief. Member of fire district association. Fortunate to have Bob Mills as fire chief. There are evacuation plans available for all property owners.

Bob Mills, Chief – Sherwood Forest Estates Volunteer Fire Department

Three structure fires in Parks and Garland Prairie in the last couple of years. Moving equipment. Sold the 1953 fire truck at public auction. Waiting for a new truck on a grant from 2001 (\$150K value we will spend \$7k). Mountain Rose subdivision (meadow to our west) is getting ready to be included into our fire district. Should hear the final results in the next 10 days. This means that starting in fall 2004 we will be getting \$30,000 additional to the budget (\$34,000 currently). The 2004 budget will be around \$52,000. Oldest truck is a 1968 vehicle. Looking for help with mechanical skills to assist with maintenance. The phone number, 928-635-9837 is manned to support requests to the fire department. If you have an emergency call 911. Meetings & training on the first Sunday (and third Saturday in Summer) of each month at 2:00 PM at the firehouse. Last call was on Memorial Day. Forest fire by the road near the RR tracks.

New road at Minstrel has a gate. Will be a pass through gate for emergency, equine or pedestrian access. It is a private road for the new subdivision. Buildings in the subdivision are for power distribution. Bob recognized all the fire fighters.

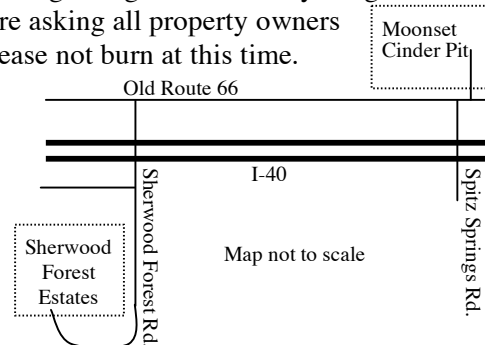
Cinder Pit Open

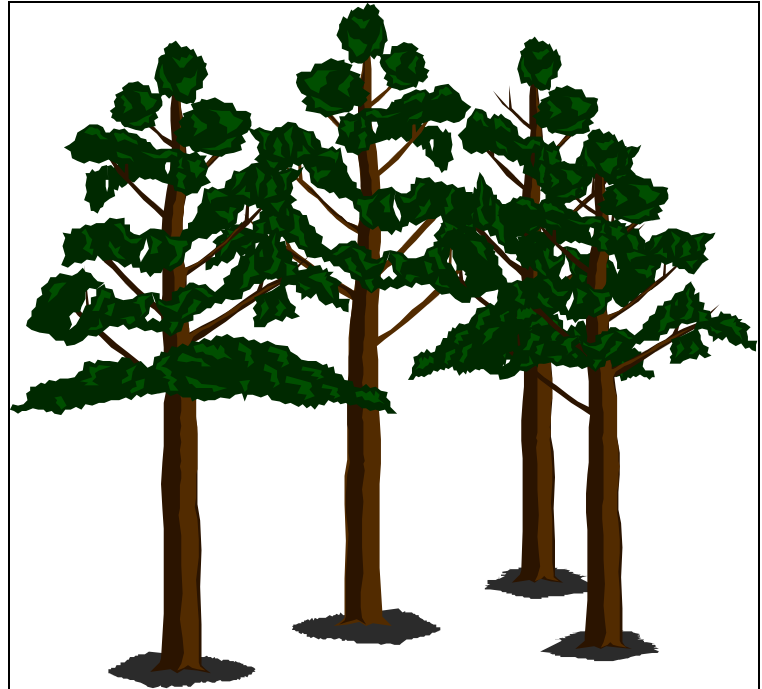
