Internet Fiber Project Update, Jud Swearingen

The Fiber Project is under way. The infrastructure is being upgraded in West Williams as of this writing. That is the old Coax from the previous Cable Company is being removed from the power poles to make way for the placement of the new Fiber. The Internet Switch should be delivered in the next few weeks. It is expected the first services will be turned up some time in December if not January. We are hoping for few delays from these winter's storms. We are next on the list for service when Williams is near completion early to mid next year.

Neighborhood Watch, Mary Anderson

The first Neighborhood Watch meeting and potluck dinner was held on June 30th. This meeting was combined with a Firewise presentation. There were about 30 community members present who enjoyed good food, friendships and the information provided. Jon Paxton from the Sheriff's office spoke on the "Ready, Set, Go" program and the importance of signing up for the alerts. He also explained the Fire Stages and what they meant and talked about the CERT (Community Emergency Response Team.) He invited attendees to consider joining William's monthly CERT trainings and meetings. Jon also addressed the issues of ATV's racing in the neighborhood and the number of rentals. He stated it is not just a problem in SFE but also Parks, Williams and the surrounding communities.

Cathy Cook, who represented Anne Dudley, the Firewise Chair, shared a video on creating defensible space around homes and a document created with the highlights she is willing to share via email. Jon Paxton and Asst. Fire Chief McDowell shared additional information concerning preparedness for a fire or an emergency. Asst. Chief McDowell stated he is available to inspect your property and make recommendations on how to create defensible space. There is no fee for this and his suggestions could save your home.

2022-24 Fire District Board

On the morning of September 5th, the Sherwood Firefighters Foundation (a 501(c)(3) tax exempt non-profit (sherwoodfirefightersfoundation.org)) presented the Sherwood Forest Fire District Board a check for \$20,000.00 in support of a new repeater tower on the top of Bill Williams Mountain. (Sherwood Fire, Ponderosa Fire and High Country Fire each donated \$2,000 to meet the \$26,000 price tag.) This tower allows for reliable communications between firefighters and multiple departments when on a fire or medical emergency. Thank you to Chief Moede and the Foundation for seeing the benefit and the resulting increased safety for 1st responders from this important upgrade. Your committed efforts are appreciated.

At the November 15th Board meeting, the Board appointed Debbie Hamby and Rosemarie Vitucci-Irving, MRRE and SFE respectively, to fill the vacant seats on the 2022-2024 District Fire Board left open by Walt Krushinsky's and Sue Hamilton departures. The Board is pleased these two individuals have chosen to assume the responsibilities and commitment to our community by accepting the Board positions.

At their first meeting on December 20th, the new 2022-2024 Fire District Board will elect the Board officers.

Walter Krushinsky was elected to the Fire Board during the November 2020 election and at the Board's first meeting was unanimously confirmed as Chairman for the remaining two-year term. Walt's devotion to the appointment and his due-diligence of agenda items was apparent at every meeting. He also had an upbeat welcome for all and conducted each meeting with professionalism and integrity. He honored his pledge of transparency and addressed and respected all concerns brought to the Board.

Sue Hamilton, as the Fire Board's Treasurer, dedicated many long hours during her ten years in the position. She kept comprehensive accounts of all transactions and reported all business conducted at the monthly Fire Board meetings. Her cheerful greetings, meticulous record keeping and knowledge of the process were exemplary.

At their final Fire Board meeting on November 15th, the POA Board gave gifts of appreciation for their community service and bade both Sue and Walt the very best as they move on from their respective Board duties and future enjoyment as they fill their free time as they choose.

Fire District Board meetings are held at 6:00PM at the Fire Station on the third Tuesday of each month. Meeting agendas are posted 24hrs in advance in the outside display case on the east side of building one. The meeting minutes are posted on the SFE website after approval and acceptance by the Board at the following meeting. As stated in last years' Newsletter, transparency is this Board's emphasis. Meetings are open to the public and all concerns and/or input are taken under advisement. Residents of both Sherwood Forest Estates and Mountain Rose Ranch Estates are welcomed and encouraged to attend.

Winter 2022 Update

Nighttime temperatures confirm winter is here. The Fire District had a relatively mild fire season and much has been accomplished with apparatus and station maintenance. The Fire Board has approved emergency power for the station and the purchase of a newer vehicle. Our team continues to improve and we are actively engaged with our surrounding fire agencies.

One of our multi agency achievements was the installation of a radio repeater on Bill Williams Mountain for the Sherwood Forest Estates Fire District. We can talk directly to our communication center from our vehicle radios now. This process was financially supported by Sherwood Firefighters Foundation. Thank you SFFF for making our firefighters more safe.

Snow is in the forecast, so please be sure to review your home safety checklist to include cleaning the chimneys, checking your smoke and CO2 detectors, putting some supplies in your car and thinking about how/who can do snow removal from your driveways.

If you have not noticed, the Forest Service has been very active with tree trimming in our area. Last year a lot of thinning was done to our south and recently the area around Kadampa Temple has been thinned. We have been talking to the FS about possible thinning in our district and hope to have a plan for spring.

I want to thank the Auxiliary and the Property Owners Association for our new saw. The saw is a lightweight cut off saw that can help in a variety of rescue situations.

Lastly, I wanted to give a shout out to our volunteers. We are very fortunate to have great people on our team, and I want to thank them for their diligence and support. We are always looking for additional help so if you are interested in becoming involved in your Fire District please give me a call.

Annual Neighborhood Cleanup

Due to the heavy rains and the resulting mosquitos, this year's Annual Cleanup was postponed until Spring 2023.



According to Zillow there were 19 properties sold from January 1st through October 10th, 2022. This included 13 existing homes and 6 parcels of raw land. Sales for raw land ranged from 85K to 280K with an average price of \$144,333. Existing homes ranged from \$200K to \$565K with an average price of \$428,923. Price per square foot averaged approximately \$333 fluctuating from \$133.37 to \$489.51 with the actual square footage of the properties ranging from 816 sq. ft. to 2,282 sq. ft. Several additional properties were pending (one at \$750K) at the time of this writing.
